New national event entry information

In 2004, all national event entries will be electronic only via NHRA.com. Entry deadline dates will be eliminated; categories will be closed when the posted quota for the event is reached regardless of date. NHRA will also reduce the grading requirements for many categories at some events. Entry fees for all Sportsman racers will increase in 2004 by \$50 per entry to cover escalating operating costs. This marks the first national event entry-fee increase for Sportsman racers since 1996. Go to NHRA.com and click on Online national event competitor registration to download the registration form, which you must complete and mail to be able to pre-enter national events.
